 - Temperance is the ability to employ self-control and moderation. (I Corinthians 9:27)
 - Demonstrate a sensitivity to the feelings of others and an appreciation of their differences by the way they interact with their classmates and their community. (Anti-bullying)
 - Temperance is required to follow all the Commandments (CCC1811)
