TIPS FOR CELEBRATING HOLY WEEK

- Be Intentional Don't make this just another week. Use this week to double down, maybe add a sacrifice, create extra space and silence for the Lord to grow in detachment
- **Pray** Spend time meditating on Jesus' love and mercy
- **Make the Liturgies a Priority** take this opportunity to teach your kids about the <u>Triduum!</u>
- Celebrate hard on Easter Rejoice in the Resurrection!

Great Ways to Experience the Week for the Entire Family

Palm Sunday: Make palm branches and do a procession, and read Matthew 21. <u>Catholic lcing</u> has many great crafts!

Holy Week: Traditions include cleaning out your home, putting together a donation, finishing Lent activities. Make <u>peg dolls</u> and find a version easy enough to let the kids do most of the work. Use these to act out the Passion and use the Easter characters to talk about the characters and story in a tangible and physical activity. They also have a printable version.

Holy Thursday: Do a <u>Lenten Story meal</u>, where each item on the menu represents a section of the story of Jesus' passion. You can also consider a Passover meal. Making unleavened bread and don't miss a family foot washing.

Good Friday: Since Good Friday is a day of fasting, check out this article for 25 great ways to devote the day to Christ! Make sure to <u>Pray the Stations of the Cross</u> and attend Good Friday liturgy.

Holy Saturday: Make a <u>paschal candle</u> and talk about the symbolism with your kids. Sit around a fire and read the vigil readings and this ancient homily.

Easter Sunday: You can work on Easter crafts all eight days of the Octave. Make <u>resurrection eggs</u> and resurrection story cookies on Easter itself, and then make <u>resurrection crafts</u> throughout the week.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

On the second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. It's an annual feast honoring devotion to Christ's tender mercy for all humanity. It is based on the private revelations that St. Faustina Kowalska received which recommend a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. Jesus himself gave Sister Faustina the Divine Mercy Chaplet in 1935.

Do you know the Divine Mercy Chaplet? In preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday, we encourage you to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet as a family this week. It has a similar structure to the Rosary (e.g. 5 sets of 10 prayers), so you can use rosary beads to help you keep your place.

April 28th - St Gianna Beretta Molla

- St. Gianna chose to sacrifice her own health, and ultimately her life, for the life of her unborn child after developing a fibroma on her uterus during pregnancy.
- Patron saint of mothers, physicians and unborn children
- Canonized May 16, 2004

April 28th - St Louis de Montfort

- St. Louis is known for his devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Rosary, the angels, and his heart for caring for the poor.
- Canonized July 20,1947



April 29th - St Catherine of Siena

- St. Catherine was a Dominican lay member and a mystic. She is known for her holiness, asceticism, and her devotion to a life of rigorous fasting. She was influential in religious and political affairs of the Church
- Patron saint of nurses
- Canonized June 29, 1461, named Doctor of the Church in 1970
