Today Jesus said in the Gospel, "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." (Matthew 5:12) He commanded us to rejoice in our persecution.

Jesus doesn't ask us to rejoice in pain for pain's sake. As he faced his agony, Jesus himself asked that the cup of suffering "might pass from me." Jesus shares our very human and very good desire to avoid pain when it makes sense to do so. He commanded us to rejoice when in pain for his sake.

That, filled with zeal to spread the Good News, we may exceed the goals of our *Archbishop's Call to Share* appeal.

Bulletin Announcement

God doesn't un-say anything. Today, Christ asserts that for those hoping for a 'free pass,' "Not... the smallest part of a letter will pass from the law" (Matthew 5:18). The law is God's unchangeable word, and all will be judged according to His law.

Yet, inasmuch as God will not recant his law, neither will he recant his mercy. Technically speaking, our hope should abound because, according to Saint Thomas Aquinas, "It is more proper for God to spare and to show mercy than to punish. For the former belongs to him by reason of his nature, the latter only by reason of our sins" (Summa Theologica II, II, 21, 2).

#1 ASK

- From the beginning, tell your parishioners you seek their participation
- ASK on ALL SIX ACTS weekends
- Announce that the Archdiocesan average is \$498 (or use your parish average, if higher)
- Acknowledge the lapsed and non-givers—ask them to take a step this year and donate a small amount
- Target & announce a 5% participation increase goal
- ASK parishioners to consider "\$1 a day" (\$365 total)
- Encourage participation during Mass (smartphone & in-pew envelopes with QR code stock the pews with pencils and envelopes)
- Encourage use of in-pew envelopes if a parishioner hasn't yet received their letter in the mail
- Give everyone the opportunity to participate!

#2 ACTS Funded Ministry

- The Speaker paints a picture for the parishioners by focusing on a ministry(s) people will remember
- The Speaker tells how the parish benefits in some way (schools, building projects, evangelization, our religious, and more)
- The Speaker story motivates parishioners to give and encourages those that have not given to the Appeal before to say 'yes' this year . With a strong presentation and ASK, parishes have GREATER RESULTS!

ACTS is the major way in which the Archdiocese raises money for its ministries and services. Over the last 10 years, thousands of Catholics have contributed millions of dollars to the ministries and services of the Archdiocese through this Appeal.
