





John Harper and Fr. Tad discuss a start-up embryo screening company in Silicon Valley, Orchid Health, that offers genetic screenings for couples of their IVF-produced embryos. The company claims to be able to sequence the entire genome of each embryo to produce an algorithm to provide a polygenic risk score. They discuss the limitations of the notion of a “risk score” as well as the pressures on couples to have “the perfect baby,” a form of objectification of offspring and imposition of quality control in the form of consumer-driven eugenics.

Federal Court Blocks Washington Law Targeting Seal of Confession

A federal court today **blocked** a new Washington state law that would have forced Catholic priests to face jail time unless they

broke the sacred seal of confession. The law at issue in **Etienne v. Ferguson**, which was set to take effect on July 27, required clergy to report abuse shared within the sacred confines of the confessional. Wilmer Hale and co-counsel Becket and First Liberty Institute represent the lead plaintiffs Archbishop Paul D. Etienne, Bishop Joseph J. Tyson, and Bishop Thomas A. Daly, who filed an initial lawsuit earlier this summer.
