# PLAN FOR A PEACEFUL CHRISTMAS BY LIBBY DUPONT




Holiday Planning Mode is almost in full swing. We buy and wrap gifts, make treats, clean the house, pack up the car and be sure everyone's jammies are matching. But in the busyness of the season, let's not forget to prepare for the one thing that makes or breaks our family gatherings: our relationships!

First, it's good to take stock. Usually, tricky relationship issues we encounter during holiday gatherings do not spring up out of nowhere, but rather they are part of a predictable pattern. Taking some time now in prayer and in conversation with your spouse or children about what stressful situations have come up in the past is the first step to flipping the script. Don't gossip or stir up drama, but honestly ask, "What situations have come up in that past that were awkward, stressful, hurtful or disappointing? What specific behaviors were at fault and how did you experience them?"



Second, it's important to address the past hurts. If it was your own behavior that hurt a loved one, acknowledge your fault and ask for forgiveness. If the hurts were caused by an extended family member with whom reconciliation is not appropriate, you can still pray together as a married couple, or as a parent and child to forgive that person. It is helpful to name the specific thing they did that was wrong, how it made you feel and then pray together to offer that to God, releasing the debt they owe you (and probably won't ever pay anyway!). # OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE FEAST DAY DECEMBER 12

The year is 1531 in what is now Mexico City. Things are a mess. Spanish missionaries have been there for several years, but due to bad interactions with previous Europeans, they are not making much progress in sharing the good news of the Gospel. The Aztecs continue to make war on neighboring peoples, in large part to fuel their need for human sacrifice to their gods. What hope for peace could there be between such different cultures? After so much hatred and violence, how could one dream of reconciliation and healing?

And yet, within a year 9 million Aztecs are baptized. How is this possible?

The answer is Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Mother of Jesus, who appears to a humble native convert, Juan Diego. Every detail of her appearance and every word she speaks conveys the Gospel, in exactly the way that makes sense to the Aztecs.

Our world today can often seem as dark and bleak as it was in 1531.

We are divided from one another, and often it seems like nothing can bridge the gap of misunderstanding, hurt and distrust. This Advent, as we wrap up the Jubilee Year, let's remember that no person and no situation, no matter how difficult or painful, is beyond hope. Let's entrust them all to Our Lady of Guadalupe and ask her to appear with exactly the right message for whatever difficulties lay in front of us.



# RUNNING TOWARDS HEAVEN TOGETHER: FEATURED MARRIED SAINT OF THE MONTH

Bl. Luigi Beltrame Quattrocchi 1880-1951 Bl. Maria Corsini 1884-1965

The Italian couple was married for 45 years, enduring two world wars together and nurturing their four children's vocations in service of the Church amid unprecedented difficulties facing Europe.

Both of their sons became priests in the 1930s and went on to concelebrate the beatification Mass of their parents with John Paul II in 2001.

Their eldest son, Father Tarcisio Beltrame, a Benedictine monk, and his younger brother Father Paolino, a Trappist, both risked their lives to secretly work with the resistance during the Nazi occupation of Italy in World War II, while the Beltrame Quattrocchi family's apartment in Rome served as a hiding place for fugitives and Italians with Jewish heritage.

A living relative of the Beltrame Quattrocchi family says that he has documents from the U.S. Office of Strategic Services (OSS) confirming the sons' collaboration in the Resistance movement, which was made even riskier by the fact that the family's apartment was located right by the headquarters of the German command in Rome. "If they had been discovered, they would have all been immediately shot," Francesco Beltrame Quattrocchi told EWTN.

The Beltrame Quattrocchis' daughters also enthusiastically served the Church. Their eldest daughter, Stefania, entered a Benedictine monastery as a nun in 1927. The youngest child in their family, Enrichetta Beltrame Quattrocchi, was a lay-consecrated woman who had been declared venerable.

The rich spiritual foundation within Luigi and Maria's marriage was at the root of their children's vocations and the courageous witness of the Beltrame Quattrocchi family during times of trial.

When St. John Paul II beatified Luigi and Maria in 2001, he said the blessed married couple "extraordinarily lived an ordinary life."

"Among the joys and anxieties of a normal family, they knew how to live an extraordinarily rich spiritual life. At the center of their life was the daily Eucharist as well as devotion to the Virgin Mary, to whom they prayed every evening with the rosary," he said.

Luigi and Maria lived lives of heroic virtue together as spouses and parents. The couple married in the Basilica of St. Mary Major on November 25, 1905. Luigi was 25 years old, and Maria was 21. Today, a plaque commemorating their marriage can be seen in the basilica's Corsini chapel.

After being married in Rome's largest Marian basilica, the couple later entrusted their family and all their children to Our Lady of Divine Love.

"From this fertile spiritual terrain sprang vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life, which shows how marriage and virginity may be closely connected and reciprocally enlightening with their common roots in the spousal love of the Lord."

Luigi worked as a lawyer, and Maria served as a catechist and wrote several books on education while raising their four children.


The couple also organized Catholic marriage preparation courses for engaged couples through their work in Catholic Action.

During World War I, the family also assisted the wounded and families facing difficulties. They also financially supported some young people who wished to become priests or enter religious life.

Luigi died of a heart attack in 1951 at the age of 71. Maria lived for another 14 years after the death of her beloved husband and continued her dedicated service to her family and the Church.

The beatified couple are buried together in Rome's Sanctuary of Divine Love.






