FLEXIBLE HYBRID TRAINING

We want you to be well formed in your own marriage, so that you can give from your own deep well of joy. That being said, we also know you have a full plate. This hybrid training option strives to accommodate your busy schedule while offering you the training you need to be well prepared!

What to expect:

- ~ 90 minutes per week of independent work as a couple:
 - 3-4 twenty-minute videos
 - reflection exercise for each video
 - work through it all at once or in small segments
- Weekly 30-45 minute live, interactive Zoom meeting
- One individual coaching call
- Unlimited lifetime support
- Start mentoring right away, attend the first available retreat to continue to deepen your own sacrament

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MENTOR COUPLE FAQ

Who can mentor?

Catholic couples married sacramentally in the Church for at least 3 years who currently embrace all the teachings of the Church on marriage and family.

What is the format?

EverMore in Love Marriage Preparation is a 7-Week Course, with each session being around 90 minutes. Ideally, it is given by one mentor couple to one engaged couple, but can also be adapted for group use. The curriculum consists of points the mentor couple makes (from an outline they are given), illustrated with stories from their own life, as well as discussion questions and exercises the engaged couple completes with guidance from their mentors. When meeting one-on-one, mentors and engaged coordinate meetings based on mutual availability.

What are qualities of a good mentor couple?

Good mentors love marriage and they love *their own marriage*. They are not perfect, but are willing to share their own experiences with the engaged. They are willing to open their hearts and homes, embracing the engaged with the love of Jesus.

What do mentors commit to?

We ask that mentor couples take a minimum of 1-2 engaged couples per year in order to stay current with the material. It is highly recommended that they periodically check in on the couples they have mentored, inviting them to future marriage enrichments offered in their area.

Why mentor?

Mentoring is a way to serve the Church together while also nurturing your own Sacrament.
