From the President



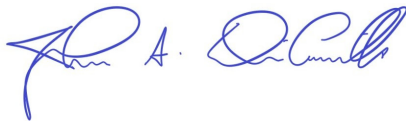
Pope Leo XIV greets Dr. Di Camillo on February 16, 2026. © Vatican Media

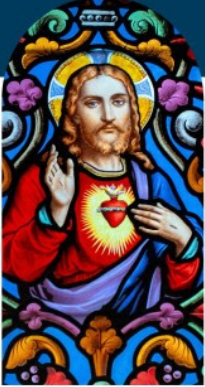
Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus June 3 - 11

Religious Freedom Week

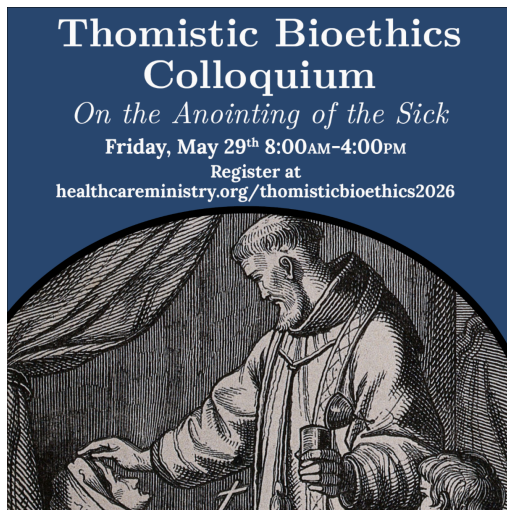
